

Northside's Mixed Income Housing and Mix Use Commercial Development

Work has begun on the corner of Howard and College for the Northside's Mixed Income Mixed Use project. Grading and site work has started on the Mixed Use side of the street which includes excavation of rock through blasting and removal of dirt that will be eventually moved across the street on the old parking lot of Spartan Mill to prepare for a 90 unit mixed income apartment development scheduled to start 2nd quarter of 2019.

The first Phase of the development consists of a \$14M Mixed Use project consisting of two buildings at the east corner of Howard Street: the main building and a clinic for VCOM. The main building will have

office space on the first floor that will include offices for Access Health, NDG, and other organizations, with two floors of apartments above, as well as a portion dedicated to Wofford College's Community Sustainability program. Wofford's space will have classroom and community engagement space for students and community partners with housing above. The Mixed Use development be complete early 2020.

Start: ME Class of 2019

The Northside Development Group, in partnership with USC Upstate Business School, has kicked off its 3rd ever entrepreneurship accelerator program, known as Start:ME Northside. Info sessions for the 2019 class began in September 2018, with more than 50 businesses interested. 64 applied for this year's class and 15 were selected to participate!

Participants will attend 14 weeks of businesses classes and partner up with 2 mentors each throughout the program. This year businesses range from a daycare facility to gift wrapping to online boutique, and many others.

The START: ME model works by injecting knowledge, networks, and capital that entrepreneurs in a community need to be successful. The program takes a

grassroots effort and connects Northside residents to larger Spartanburg area entrepreneurial resources. The goal is to take an intentional approach to uncover

these local entrepreneurs and give them access to knowledge through the business school, mentors through community partners and capital through a local community development finance institution (CDFI), CommunityWorks. This program will grow wealth from within the community by helping residents increase earnings and provide job opportunities through their businesses creating a healthier, more economically stable community.

Employment Available through Construction Training Program

A Construction Training program has been established through a partnership between the Northside Development Group, Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System, Spartanburg Community College, SC Works, Spartanburg Chamber of Commerce, and the Upstate Workforce Board. This program offers scholarships for training in various areas of construction, including masonry, framing, drywall, tile work, and other specified building trades. Participants receive an NCCER (National Center for Construction Education and Research) certification. Graduates have the opportunity to enroll in a paid Apprenticeship program offered in partnership with SCWorks and Spartanburg Regional Hospital.

48 participants have taken classes through the program since June 2017.

Employment opportunities are immediately available after graduation with the potential to earn up to \$22/hour.

The Chamber of Commerce is currently taking applications for future classes, which may include Core classes, plumbing, electrical, and other trades. Applicants may be eligible for scholarships. If you already have experience in the construction field, NDG will be assisting Harper Corporation and Creative Builders in taking applications for projects related to the Northside.

Brawley Street Phase 3

Phase 3 of the Brawley Street Model Block includes 7 new mixed income rental units. Leasing is underway. The project was completed at the end of January. Homes of Hope, a nonprofit affordable housing developer, will lease these 7 new units of mixed income housing to families earning 50%-120% of the area median income the rental rate will be between \$550-\$950 for the 3 bedroom 2 bathroom units. Northside residents will have the first choice of renting these homes if they meet all other leasing requirements.

Although NDG is spearheading the project, Homes of Hope will own the unit and James White Enterprises will manage the properties. Units are now available. For more information visit JamesWhiteLLC.com or call 864-301-8163.





Housing Trust Fund Emergency Repair Program

NDG is dedicated to assisting homeowners in the Northside to stay in their homes. NDG is currently assisting homeowners through the South Carolina Housing Finance and Development Authorities Housing Trust Fund (HTF) program. Homeowners in the Northside with qualifying income may be eligible to receive up to \$8,000.00 in emergency repairs for projects such as roofing, HVAC, accessibility ramps, and many other projects.

Dr. T.K. Gregg Community Center


The official groundbreaking for the new Dr. T.K. Gregg Community Center was held on November 30th. The \$16 million City led project, being constructed by Harper General Contractors, is a collaborative effort between the City, NDG, and other area partners.

In an interview with the Spartanburg Herald Journal, Erica Brown (District 6 Representative) said "The Dr. T.K. Gregg Community Center is about people. It is about our Northside residents, and it is about our residents across the city. It represents more opportunities for a healthier, more vibrant city, It will be about programs that help enrich the lives of our youth, and lift up those in need through our afterschool programs, financial literacy classes and the like.'

Construction is expected to be completed in the first half of 2020.
